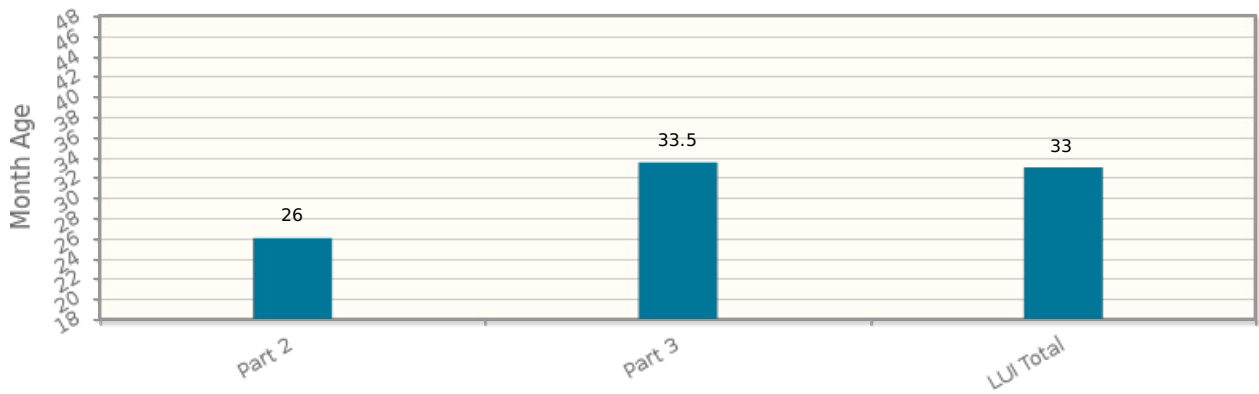

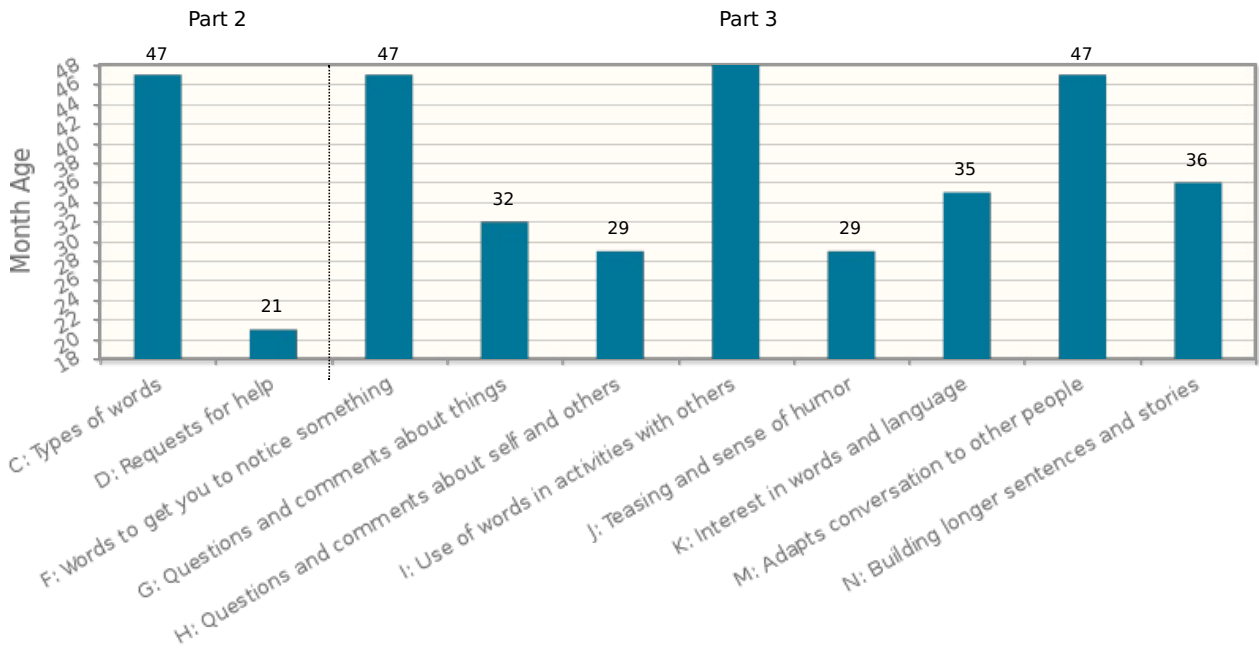

\* Permissibility was determined according to the following criteria in accordance with recommended practice in the research literature (e.g., M-CDI Manual, Fenson et al., 2007, p. 43). For each Subscale, Part or Total LUI score, a "language age" percentile equivalent score is provided only when a child's raw score was AT or BELOW the 50th percentile (median) score for the oldest 47 age month of the norms for boys/girls. That is, an age-equivalent score was NOT calculated if the child's raw score exceeded the median score for 47-month-olds. In such cases, a language age percentile equivalent score of "> 47 months" is noted in the report.
